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The 1000th Lifting: A New Chapter of Hope from the BUIC Well



The Floating Storage and Offloading (FSO) Gagak Rimang team celebrated their 1,000th lifting, marking a cumulative production of 660 million barrels of oil.

Since commencing production 15 years ago, EMCL's operations in the Cepu Block have achieved a safety record of zero incidents, culminating in the milestone of the 1000th lifting.

In mid-August, ExxonMobil Cepu Limited (EMCL) and SKK Migas announced the 1000th lifting of crude oil from the Banyu Urip and Kedung Keris fields. This milestone also marks a total cumulative production of over 660 million barrels of oil, achieved through safe, reliable, and efficient operations.

Around the same time, the Banyu Urip Infill Clastic (BUIC) well successfully recorded its first production of 13,300 barrels of oil. The development of this new well will boost oil production in the Cepu Block and further enhance Indonesia's energy security. ▪

Community Clean-Up and Planting 35,000 Mangroves for a Better Environment

ExxonMobil Cepu Limited (EMCL) recently launched the ExxonMobil Volunteer Program (EVP) at the beginning of August. A total of 65 EMCL volunteers participated in activities involving the planting, nurturing, and care of 35,000 mangrove seedlings in the coastal area of Sedayulawas Village, Lamongan, East Java.

Since 2006, ExxonMobil volunteers have dedicated approximately 26,290 hours to various community service activities that benefit the neighboring communities around their operational areas. ▪

The Nguruan Village Market in Soko District, Tuban Regency, is becoming increasingly bustling. The number of traders and visitors continues to grow in the area, which spans no more than 3,400 square meters. As the village market expands, the local economy is also on the rise.

The progress of the Nguruan Village Market is a direct result of infrastructure development efforts. Services and comfort have improved alongside the upgrades to market facilities. This development is part of the Community Development Program (PPM) initiated by ExxonMobil Cepu Limited (EMCL) and SKK Migas.
